Colonel Corey M. Ramsby is the Commander of Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps, Maxwell Air Force Base, Ala. The mission of AFROTC is to recruit, educate, train, motivate and develop officer candidates into Air Force commissioned officers through a comprehensive college program comprised of fundamental Air Force doctrine, academic instruction and practical leadership experiences. Prior to his current assignment, Ramsby was the Deputy Commander, AFROTC.

Ramsby was commissioned as a distinguished graduate of the Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps program at Purdue University in 1994. A career cyberspace operations officer, he has served in numerous operational and staff assignments, including Headquarters Air Force Space Command, Headquarters Air Force Personnel Center, Headquarters Air Force, the Joint Chiefs of Staff and Air University. His commands include the 55th Communications Group at Offutt AFB, Neb., 375th Communications Squadron at Scott AFB, Ill., and the 54th Combat Communications Squadron at Robins AFB, Ga. Additionally, he served as the aide-de-camp to the commander, Air Force Special Operations Command, and is a fully qualified Joint Specialty Officer. Ramsby has deployed multiple times in support of Operations Desert Fox, Southern Watch and Enduring Freedom. Ramsby transferred to the United States Space Force in July 2021.
